Sapling Transplanting Instructions:

- * You must wait until the temperature is 70 or below. Late August or September
- * Transplant the saplings in the soil they are currently in
- * Place chicken wire in a circular shape around the entire plant and on top to avoid critters
- * Place in direct sunlight in open space, water at least once a week until the first frost.
