Meeting Minutes

- WHC members approved February 11, 2019 meeting minutes.
- Chair shared her well-planned PowerPoint presentation that detailed the accomplishments of WHC/WHS in 2018. Attendees provided some minor suggestions to further strengthen its potential benefits to Warrington residents. Highlights of 2018 WHC accomplishments:
 - Reviewed progress on 10 Folly Road schoolhouse restoration and highlighted structural issues in basement
 - Reviewed and provided input on 5 historic properties
 - o Reviewed and cleared 15 properties without historic significance
 - Reviewed elementary school and educational outreach programs
 - Provided historical interpretation on Daniel P. Bradley, Jr. Memorial Stone and historic uses of National Irwin house.
- New Business.
 - Suggestions to name new streets. Chair received an inquiry to suggest names for new streets in Perry Farm development. Chair and attendees suggested using the names of families that had land within or near the development in Eighteenth Century. Attendees also suggested considering using names of individuals who had significant impacts in the history of Township's developments. Chair will compile a list for the lawyer of the developer.
