Warrington Baseball Report and Upgrade to Barness Park Proposal - presented by Kevin "Eric" Boyle, president

- Spring 2022 very successful, >450 kids
 75.8% are Twp residents
 discussion of encouraging coordination between sports organizations for game/practice times to allow kids to participate in more than one sport improvements successful
 visitors always positive about Warrington fields
 improvements still needed 3 main projects
- 1. Irrigation Hose Bib Project
 1300' of hose to the sides of each field
 pull lines and drip in access boxes
 no cost to twp funded by baseball
 system will be winterized, with backflow preventers, etc

• 2. Backstop Replacement Project

current backstop very aged, in poor repair and inadequate to current needs during recent activity balls have gone over and hit cars on Bristol Rd noted as a safety hazard

new system to be 30' high retractable net system

• 3. Tower Replacement Project (storage and scoreboard)

Drawings of proposed tower shared and presented to group

very large project

request twp remove existing tower and put in new concrete pad (24' x 14') Baseball Assoc will do all from that point forward

timeframe – like to have completed by winter 2022, noted this unlikely as would need to be a budget item that would need to be added for 2023

Phased Approach suggested

Irrigation first as Baseball Assoc handling cost and installation

Backstop this fall (mid Oct 22) as this is a safety issue

Tower needs to be tabled for moment to allow to be brought to Board of Supervisors and added as agenda item for consideration of project and budgetary concerns

Andy will request addition to the BOS agenda for Aug 9th, Eileen in agreement

urgency of project noted due to safety issues described above

Rick motion to request BOS to request Public Works demolish existing backstop and replace with new net system. Joanne 2^{nd} . All approved

anticipate work to initiate mid-Oct 22

updated/final specs for net system to be forwarded to board and BOS for review

 Presentation and approval of project required for waiver
