

WARRINGTON TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES FOR JUNE 11, 2013

The regular meeting of the Warrington Township Board of Supervisors was held on June 11, 2013, 7:30 p.m., at the Township Building located at 852 Easton Road, Warrington, PA 18976. The members present were as follows:
