

THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON WARRINGTON TOWNSHIP AND BUCKS COUNTY

Governor Tom Wolf ordered the closure of all non-life-sustaining businesses by 8 pm, March 19, 2020. Enforcement began March 23, 2020 and will remain closed until further notice. Life sustaining businesses can remain open. Governor Wolf placed the “Stay-at-Home” order on March 23, 2020.

A recent report from Bucks County Emergency Services reveals total confirmed cases are 1,273; recoveries 264 and deaths 41 within the County of Bucks.

County government buildings closed to the public, on March 24, 2020, in compliance with Gov. Wolf's stay-at-home order. Essential government services will continue to operate with limited staffing to continue serving public needs while striving to increase its public health services. .

Warrington Township closed all township facilities to the public on March 17, 2020. Staff is working remotely, while a couple of employees are staffing the Township Building. Residents can still contact township staff by calling (215) 343-9350.

All Bucks County Parks along with Warrington Township Parks are closed. However, the trails in Warrington Township remain open. Please wear masks and follow social distancing protocol when using these trails.

All schools will remain closed for the remainder of the academic year.
