DO YOU KNOW...That Warrington is a township? It is not a city, borough or town. Warrington is one of 1,454 second class townships in the Commonwealth. Townships are divided between first class and second class depending on population per square mile. The entire land mass of Pennsylvania is incorporated into one of the above governmental entities generally referred to as a municipality. There are 2,562 municipalities in Pennsylvania. Warrington is a second class township and follows the Second Class Township Code under a Commonwealth law enacted on May 1, 1933. There are 56 cities, 958 boroughs 93 first class townships and one town. There are 67 counties in Pennsylvania. Warrington Township is one of 54 municipalities in Bucks County. The governing body of a township is a Board of Supervisors. Boards of Supervisors can consist of three or five members. A Supervisor serves a six year term and is elected by the general public.
